The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is a day of special joy for us because of the great love and honor shown to Jesus throughout the world in all the Eucharistic Processions, Benedictions, and devotions offered on this day. It is also our Community's Feast day and a day when we renew our vows at Mass right before we receive Holy Communion. Gazing upon Love Divine, we humbly wonder: "What return can we give to the Lord for all that He has done for us?"

To tell Jesus we have chosen Him and chosen to belong to Him forever is a gift we can give to Him *every day of the year*. Everyone longs to be chosen, to know that we are loved and accepted and that this love will endure. Aware that Jesus, too, has the same desire, our Founder Father Gerald wrote the following prayer:
