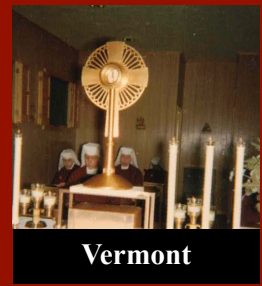
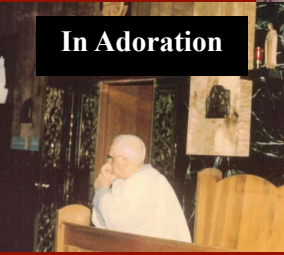
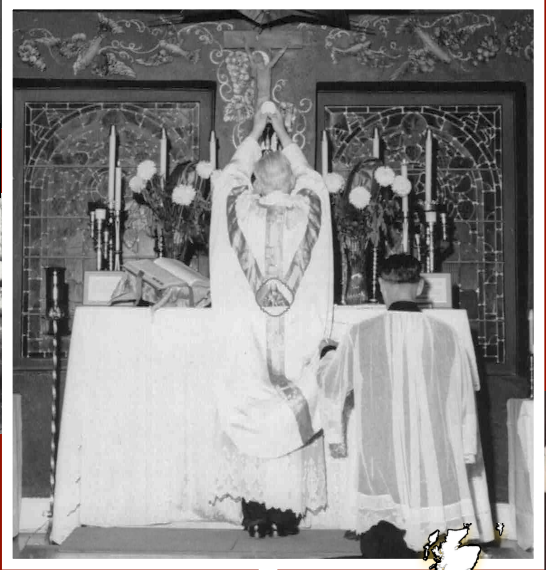
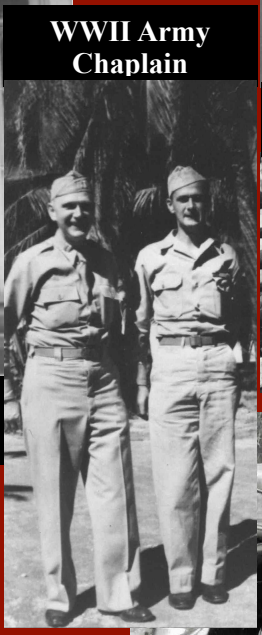
Venite Adoramus!
